

MAP I **Abbotsbury Castle** Hillfort

Eweleaze

Suggested start point: Abbotsbury village ● Walk Distance: 8.25km / 5 miles Up out of the picturesque, monastic village of Abbotsbury via a small holloway and past Abbotsbury Ironstone and Upper Greensand exposures, climbing to the ridge with stunning views over the Jurassic Coast and along to Abbotsbury Castle, an Iron Age hillfort, down along a path following the parish boundary and along the coast, passing close to St Catherine's Chapel and back into the village.

Facilities: Pubs, cafes and public toilets in Abbotsbury.

Public Transport: The X53 between Bridport and Weymouth stops in Abbotsbury and runs hourly in summer (less frequently October - April). Timetables: www.jurassiccoasterbus.co.uk 0333 014 3490 (Mon - Sat 7am - 7pm, Sun 7am - 6pm) Further information: www.southdorsetridgeway.org.uk


Field names The field names on this map are taken from Tithe maps and manuscripts that were produced following the 1836 Tithe Commutation Act. These recorded the names of all owners and occupiers of land in the parish that were liable to tithes - a tax of one tenth of everything they produced.

Ironstone exposures, holloway. Start: Portesham village MAP 3: Valley of Stones

Features on this walk include: Grey Mare and her Colts long barrow, Kingston stone circle, Bride valley, bluebells and butterflies, Celtic field systems and sarsen boulder train. Start: Littlebredy

MAP 4: Black Down + Bronkham Hill Features on this walk include: Hardy Monument -

the highest point of the Ridgeway with spectacular view, heathland, gravel pit, bluebells and bilberries, Bronze Age barrow cemetery, sinkholes, skylarks, ancient stone slab walling, dry valley. Start: Black Down car park

MAP 5: Bincombe Bumps Features on this walk include: Bronze Age round barrows, strip lynchets and butterflies. Much of this route is along a traffic free cycle path. Start: Littlemoor library

MAP 6: White Horse Hill

Features on this walk include: Osmington White Horse, barrows, butterflies, strip lynchets, drove road and historic villages. Start: Either Sutton Poyntz or Osmington


